| • If you have previously experienced any allergic reactions (itch, rash, etc.) to any medicines or foods.  |
| If you have: bronchial asthma/history of bronchial asthma, bronchospasm, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease,  |
| heart failure, sinus bradycardia, atrioventricular block, cardiogenic shock, renal disorder, right-sided heart failure   |
| secondary to pulmonary hypertension, congestive heart failure, diabetic ketoacidosis, metabolic acidosis, diabetes,  |
| liver dysfunction, or history of intraocular surgery.  |
| If you wear contact lenses.  |
| • If you are pregnant or breastfeeding.  |
| •If you are taking any other medicinal products. (Some medicines may interact to enhance or diminish medicinal   |
| effects. Beware of over-the-counter medicines and dietary supplements as well as other prescription medicines.)  |
| Dosing schedule (How to take this medicine)  |
| • Your dosing schedule prescribed by your doctor is(( to be written by a healthcare professional))   |
| • In general, apply 1 drop at a time, twice a day. Strictly follow the instructions.   |
| • Make sure not to let the tip of the container touch any part of your eye.  |
| • After applying, keep your eyes closed without blinking for a while (1 to 5 minutes).   |
| •If this medicine gets on your eyelid, wipe it off immediately.  |
| • If you need to use other eye drops at the same time, wait more than 5 minutes.   |
| • If you miss a dose, apply the missed dose as soon as possible. However, if it is almost time for the next dose, skip   |
| the missed dose and follow your regular dosing schedule. You should not apply two doses at one time.   |
| •If you accidentally apply more than your prescribed dose, consult with your doctor or pharmacist.   |
| •Do not stop applying this medicine unless your doctor instructs you to do so.  Precautions while taking this medicine   |
| Frecautions while taking this medicine   |
| Possible adverse reactions to this medicine  |
| The most commonly reported adverse reactions include stinging eyes (smarting/burning sensation/foreign body  |
| sensation/lacrimation/pain/itchy eyes). If any of these symptoms occur, consult with your doctor or pharmacist.  |
| The symptoms described below are rarely seen as initial symptoms of the adverse reactions indicated  |
| in brackets. If any of these symptoms occur, stop taking this medicine and see your doctor   |
| immediately.   |
| •foreign body sensation in eyes, eye pain, bloodshot eyes [ocular pemphigoid]  |
| •shortness of breath, breathing difficulty, wheezing (whistling sound) [bronchospasm, respiratory distress,  |
| respiratory failure]   |
| •respiratory distress, loss of consciousness, dizziness on standing up [heart block, congestive heart failure, cerebral  |
| ischemia, cardiac arrest, cerebrovascular disorder]  |
| •fever, facial erythema, general malaise [systemic lupus erythematosus]  |
| •fever, redness/erosion of mucosa, erythema [Stevens-Jonson syndrome, toxic epidermal necrolysis]  |
| The above symptoms do not describe all the adverse reactions to this medicine. Consult with your doctor or pharmacist if you notice any symptoms of concern other than those listed above. |
